Dear Ms. Welman

I visited your hospital today following a discussion with my GP about the possibility of getting a full body scan to uncover the illegal and reprehensible activities of the Nottinghamshire NHS Healthcare Trust in assisting in the implantation of genetically-engineered bioelectronic devices in my body possibly in 2013, with the involvement of some unknown GE company, along with elements of the British State (Security Services) at the behest of the then Head of State.

My GP told me that it was very unlikely that the NHS would undertake such a body scan (and I presume that this would involve something like an NMR scan) firstly, because there was no clinical necessity for it, and secondly, because it was the NHS themselves who were responsible for these illegal operations. He advised me to talk to a private hospital.

At the Albyn Hospital today I had a brief discussion with staff in the Imaging Department, where I was told that I could not purchase a scan privately, without a reference from my GP outlining a clinical need.

Now, there is no clinical need, but I am stuck in the situation where I am certain beyond reasonable doubt that there have been covert and illegal operations to put implants into my body (and the only way to prove it is to get a scan), but I am seemingly unable to get anyone to assist in uncovering the truth.

I have written to the Head of Practise at my GP's surgery to request a clinical referral to enable your organisation to go ahead and undertake a full body scan with the appropriate technology, for which I am willing to pay (within reason). Can you advise me about your policy of not permitting the purchase of a scan, regardless of clinical need? It is imperative that I uncover the truth and getting an appropriate body scan is vital towards this objective. What are the circumstances under which you would permit a suitable body scan regardless of clinical need?
